With spring around the corner, we hope, just a reminder that both **District 1 COP Shops** have **graffiti remediation** supplies available. These include paint in several shades and graffiti removal scrubs. **Graffiti** is not a victimless crime. In the West Colfax area, a tagger who

goes by FAZER, has done an estimated \$5,000 in property damage. If you find graffiti please file either a police report or an online report with denvergov.org. If you see someone tagging please call 911 – it is a crime in progress.

The District 1 COP Shops are trying to increase the hours of operations. For this to occur requires more volunteers. You only need to commit to a minimum of 12 volunteer hours a year.
